## Sports Trivia for Kids — Answer Key

**1. C 5**

Each basketball team plays with 5 players on the court at a time: typically a point guard, shooting guard, small forward, power forward, and center.

**2. C A hat trick**

Scoring three goals in a single game is called a hat trick. The term originally comes from cricket.

**3. C 4**

A baseball diamond has 4 bases: first base, second base, third base, and home plate.

**4. C Tennis**

Wimbledon is the oldest and most prestigious tennis tournament in the world, held annually in London, England.

**5. C 6**

A touchdown is worth 6 points. Teams can then try for an extra point (1 point) by kicking, or a two-point conversion.

**6. C Blue, yellow, black, green, and red**

The five Olympic rings are blue, yellow, black, green, and red on a white background. They represent the five continents.

**7. C Basketball**

A slam dunk is a basketball move where a player jumps and pushes the ball directly through the hoop from above.

**8. C 9**

A regulation baseball game has 9 innings. If the score is tied after 9, extra innings are played.

**9. C The Vince Lombardi Trophy**

The Vince Lombardi Trophy is awarded to the Super Bowl winner. It is named after the legendary Green Bay Packers coach.

**10. C The goalkeeper**

Only the goalkeeper can use their hands, and only inside their own penalty area. All other players must use their feet, head, or body.

**11. C Ice hockey**

Ice hockey uses a hard rubber puck that players hit with sticks across the ice.

**12. C 50 meters**

An Olympic-sized swimming pool is 50 meters long. A short course pool is 25 meters.

**13. C The three-point line**

Shots made from behind the three-point arc are worth 3 points instead of the usual 2.

**14. C A strike**

Knocking down all ten pins with the first ball is a strike, marked with an X on the scorecard.

**15. C England**

Modern soccer rules were established in England in 1863 when the Football Association was formed in London.
